## GROWTH AT OUR LADY'S MONTESSORI SCHOOL



Since I arrived at OLMS in 2018, our school has gone through some exciting developments. In 2019, OLMS expanded to include elementary aged children 6-9 years old. Last December, after much discernment, we decided to continue the expansion to include children 9-12 years old. It is truly a delight to walk with children and their families for six more years. The Lord has also blessed our little school with a swell of enrollment, beginning last fall with 43 children to this fall enrolling 64 children. Please pray for us as we continue to repurpose our space and carefully strategize how to accommodate our growing enrollment.

## SR. MARIA OF MERCIFUL LOVE, SOLT

One of my first encounters with Sr. Maria of Merciful Love was watching her do a "Wonder woman" jump into a pool. She lived the wonder of what God's grace can do in a person's life. "Everything is grace," said St. Therese of Lisieux. Sr. Maria exemplified a heart transformed, animated, and compelled by grace.

Often she was known to sing, "Jesus, Jesus, Jesus," while doing the dishes, eating a snack, preparing something for ministry, or wandering down the hall. This was her life- He was her life. Sr. Maria was born on July 2, 1986, in Kingsville, Texas to Antonio Medina and Deanna (Martinez) Guerra. From her entrance into this world, she was marked for a life set on Christ. She was baptized as a baby, made her first communion at the age of eight, and was confirmed as a teenager. Her faith was gifted to her by her parents at Baptism. This faith was nourished through "Mom Beve" (a parishioner) who never let her miss Sunday mass or youth group. Countless retreats as a young adult continued to form her in the faith and developed a deep love for the Lord. His love compelled her to respond to His call to consecrated life.

The Sisters of Our Lady of the Most Holy Trinity are honored to have had her as a sister, friend, and joyful witness of consecrated life. She was no stranger to hardship, suffering, and hurt. It was her ability to generously lean into God's grace during difficult moments that made her a shining example. She will be forever remembered as a sister who forgave much, served with joy, loved with all her heart, and trusted in Jesus' loving embrace.
