## FIRST PROFESSION OF SR. MARIA CLARA IN BENQUE VIEJO, BELIZE



On December 7, 2020, the Vigil of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, Sr. Maria Julia made her first profession of vows and received a new religious name: Sr. Maria Clara.

My parents had a total of 19 children. Sadly, 4 were miscarried and 5 of my siblings passed away when they were young. At a young age I had a desire to be baptized, and when I was nine years old my dad allowed me to be baptized. After that we moved and didn't go to Mass for many years. But when I was 18, I made my First Communion and Confirmation.

I first felt the call from God at a young age. When I was 12 years old, I wanted to enter the Sisters of St. Vincent de Paul but my dad didn't approve. My constant prayer was that if God was calling me to religious life, He would put sisters in my path. Sometime after that, I met Sr. Asunción and Sr. Marta, SOLT. From then on, my experience with the Lord has deepened every day and I have discovered a greater fullness in all my being. Since my encounter with God, I have discovered a deep happiness.

The day I professed my vows, I felt so much joy that I don't even know how to explain it with words. During the ceremony, when they called my name, I felt like it was God Himself who had called me. Thanks to this community, in which I have found the face of Christ, and I have felt welcomed and loved. Thanks be to God!

Sr. Maria Clara is from Las Flores del Chiquibul, a remote village about 4 hours from the SOLT mission in Melchor de Mencos, Guatemala.

### WITNESSES OF HOPE

Eighteen years ago, I arrived in North Dakota to begin my aspirancy with the Sisters of Our Lady and to serve at St. Ann's Mission with the Chippewa and Metis people of the Turtle Mountains. The native people welcomed us and shared their culture and unique blending of Native American and French traditions. The joyful witness of the SOLT ecclesial family team and the way the priests and sisters loved and served the people made me fall in love with our SOLT community. The other unique aspect to the mission and the team that made a huge impact on me was the lay missionary volunteers who came with such enthusiasm, love, and a generous spirit.

Bishop John Folda, Bishop of Fargo, instituted a Marian Year of Grace for the people of the Turtle Mountains from October



2019-2020. A couple notable highlights of this grace-filled year were when a large number of people consecrated themselves to Jesus through Mary, and when Sr. Caritas Sparke came to visit us in the spring of 2020 to help renew the Volunteer Program. In the midst of the pandemic, God chose this time to send us the great gift of young people willing to serve. During the last week of the Marian Year, our new volunteers began to arrive and we now have a team of ten serving.

This group is exceptional in their prayer, joy, and graced friendships. Whether they serve in our little Catholic school, development office, food pantry, youth ministry, preparing for summer camp, or participating and enriching the life of the parish, they are a tremendous blessing. So many different personalities and gifts; yet one family in Christ. They are true witnesses of hope!
