to the loving welcome at each mission, I felt like part of the work my SOLT family was doing.

The first stop was in Thailand where SOLT teams have been serving two drug rehabilitation centers for over thirty years. It was edifying to see the beautiful service of our SOLT community to very remote and poor areas. Our charism, to serve those in deepest apostolic need, is very concretely lived in remote island missions in this beautiful and joyful country.

SOLT has been serving in Papua for 31 years and now has six native sisters to boast! They serve in parish ministries, Archdiocesan offices, and also run a small orphanage. I was very blessed to stay at the apostolic convent that serves the orphanage. The ten children are precious and the sisters care for them very lovingly. It was a beautiful experience of poverty and simplicity, which was easily accepted as they had everything they needed! I was so grateful to help connect the two regions of our SOLT community and be present to one of the remotest places of the world.


